- Select five additional books to read. See below.

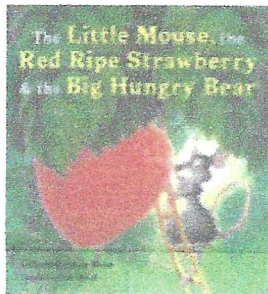

*The local libraries have several copies of the books or you may choose to purchase your own.

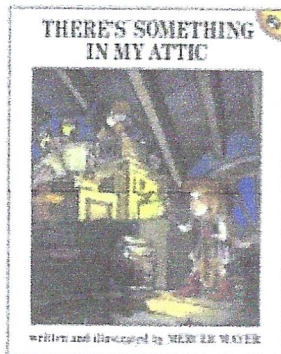
